Contract Training Benchmarking





Most community college continuing education divisions include non-credit workforce training, life and leisure or other non-credit education and contract training for local business and industry. We have expanded the Workforce Training Benchmark Project to include the additional areas usually incorporated into the continuing education division at your college and have added measures to help compare the success of these areas. With an increased emphasis on credentials and a tightening of community college budgets, it is time to start tracking and measuring your college's successes in these areas so college leadership, the community, legislatures and other stakeholders will know the impact continuing education makes on students' lives and the community.

Contract training is a very important component of most continuing education divisions as it is the main revenue-generator for CE. Last year's results from the project showed that some CE divisions get over 94 percent of their gross revenue from their contract training while other colleges only get 7 percent of their revenue from contracts. The median was 43 percent. Contract training contributed \$867,289 (median) to the CE budget.

On the expenditure side a median of 31 percent of the

division's expenditures were incurred for contract training. The median number of organizations served by contract training at community colleges was 72, but the median market penetration was only .3 percent. That suggests that contract training has the potential to grow at most community colleges.
